Because my family felt physical symptoms in both of my children, particularly in my younger one, my son, that we were not willing to subject my children to masking again due to the symptoms that we saw both emotional and physical, and we never received answers from the school or from the Department of Health or from the Governor in regards to our concerns.

So we decided that we would not comply with the mask mandate and we sent them to school without masks. They were accepted for the first four days of school;

September 9 and 10, and then again that was a Thursday to Friday, as well as the following Monday and Tuesday.

On that Wednesday we were called and told to pick up our children, because they did not have masks on. They did not wear a mask for those four and a half days of school. My husband picked up our children and they were barred from entering again and they have not been to school since.

- Okay. Has the school given you any materials, any type of books to assist you in having your children learn at home while they're not in school?
- They have not. In fact we have numerous requests in writing, as well as numerous phone calls to the superintendent, to the curriculum coordinator, to the vice principal and we have received no response.

The school committee voted last Tuesday on a policy that would actually exclude my children from receiving books. In their policy if a child is quarantined they have access to the educational materials necessary to continue with school at home.

However, if a family is non compliant with the mask mandate they are not eligible for those materials.

Let's go back to last year, when your children were in school. You testified just now briefly about some concerns you had. Could you elaborate on that?

So my children kept coming home complaining of headaches, that was one of the most consistent things that began to really concern me. Especially my son, just on a regular basis, nearly every day they would complain of having a headache when they get home from school.

On numerous occasions, again my son in particular, but both children would complain of nausea. Previous to last year they always want to eat a snack in the afternoon and they would often times turn it down because their stomachs were upset. They were nauseous.

I also, it was so apparent that they were grumpy and lethargic, especially as compared to previous years. And my daughter, actually she had been in school for two years she had enormous, there was an enormous difference between how she behaved coming home from school last year

young kindergartner to just even give himself a moment, I kept trying to encourage him, just pull it down for a second and take a breath and put it back up, and he had a teacher -- an aide in particular that was so strict that he began to exhibit anxiety and --

MS. WYRZYKOWSKI: Objection, your Honor.

That's a medical conclusion. That's a medical diagnosis.

THE COURT: Sustained.

MR. PICCIRILLI: Can she finish her answer or is it just stricken from anxiety or?

THE COURT: Why don't you ask new question without leading her.

MR. PICCIRILLI: Okay. Thank you, your Honor. To get back to the enforcement of the masks, did something change during the year in terms of mask breaks? Yes. So initially we were reassured that the children would receive -- would be taken outside a great deal, would get breaks. We were promised breaks from our superintendant and in November those were taken away entirely. They got absolutely no breaks indoors or outdoor, and it was just as the weather was getting too cold to take them outside as well.

Until they would go rather the entire school day only getting a break for lunch and snacks, which was silent. They were not allowed to speak in the duration

of the time they were eating. So as soon as they were done eating they were required to put their masks back up.

My daughter repeatedly described how she would ask to use the bathroom so she could get take her mask down for a moment, and so the freshest air she was getting was in a bathroom. And my daughter also described to me how in the cafeteria --

MS. WYRZYKOWSKI: Objection, your Honor. We're talking about hearsay now.

THE COURT: That is sustained.

Let me ask you this, Ms. Cirignotta, did you make inquiries to any government agencies to try and get information regarding masks?

I had a great deal of concern over what I witnessed in my children. In fact, to the point that it was keeping me awake at night. I kept finding myself waking up at odd hours of the night and being unable to fall asleep just worrying because I wasn't happy with what was happening with my children. Naturally, the most noted to their physical bodies.

And I was very concerned about the emotional aspect as well. But again with my school, and I started with my principal and very quickly realized that she didn't have any safety date that I was looking for for reassurance.

So I went to my superintendent, who also didn't. And as the year progressed and cases were declining and everywhere was starting to relieve -- people were becoming increasingly relieved of mask mandates everywhere except schools. I began to wonder why schools in particular had all of these mandates.

And I decided, especially as the weather got warmer and I was in an un air conditioned classroom as well as my children, because I'm a teacher, as it got hotter and hotter and I see the children suffer, as I perceived it. I decided that I would go to first the Governor. daily phone calls to the Governor and his constituent services office, and I got nowhere with that. I left message after message after message to no avail what.soever.

So in my quest for answers and in my desperation for some information, I decided to submit requests for public record, APRA request, and I submit the same request to the Department of Health, to RIDE and to the Governor's office.

Instead of me going to every school committee in the State to try and find out what those policies are, the State made an affirmative statement in their executive order that they knew which districts had passed policies. They should have the burden of producing that to me.

I'll be happy to introduce it if they will produce it to me.

THE COURT: But do you have it?

MR. PICCIRILLI: No, because they haven't given it to me. They refused -- as with Ms. Cirignotta, they completely ignored my request.

MS. WYRZYKOWSKI: Your Honor, right now as I stand here I represent the defendant named in this lawsuit, not the Rhode Island Department of Education.

I've never received requests from opposing counsel for that information, nor has my co counsel. It's the best evidence rule at stake here, not for interpretation of what was said, the actual document itself. And as a parent of four, it just killed me to know that they were sitting in — whether it be going outside for recess, all the things they were doing in this masks and it was killing me that they had gone through the whole school day.

So at the time my wife basically, and I don't why she did it because I would have told them to suck it up. My wife drove them to school, picked them up every day because there was just one less hour in the morning and then another hour in the afternoon that they didn't have to wear a mask.

So because they would have to wear a mask on the school bus?

Correct. So yes, you had to wear a mask on the school bus, you had to wear a mask in school and a mask on the way home. So by her picking them up, dropping them off, picking them up, it was just one less hour we can get them out of the mask and that's why she did it.

And I wouldn't have done it, because that's a huge inconvenience but she's willing to do that and I'm grateful for that.

So, now if we can get to what your children told you

And that lead to me to start asking questions of what their school day is like, and that's part of the reason I'm here is because there were certain teachers that were good and allowing them to have mask breaks but most of the teachers and most of the time they were in their masks the entire day and they -- I could see, and I asked them what was causing them the discomfort, and they were basically telling me that they were nervous about if the mask hung at school they got in trouble. If it wasn't on properly. That's what they were telling me. They were telling me they weren't -- it was really difficult for them to go through the school day with the mask on and they weren't allowed to take breaks, and if the mask was improper they in some way or form they were spoken to.

For at least my girls that was embarrassing. They don't like to get in trouble. They don't like any

And lastly, you mentioned the story about a teacher with a noodle, like a pool noodle?

Apparently, the pool noodle was used because, I don't know if the pool noodle is 6 feet. But basically the teacher was using a pool noodle to measure and keep the kids away with a pool noodle, and I was astonished that this was going on in a public education setting, where a pool noodle was being used to separate the kids, to the point where my son is, I don't even enjoy the school day. I can't — there's nothing about it — and I'm not saying that the school needs to be an entertaining place, but it should be a place where kids can learn in a friendly environment and not be nervous or get in trouble.

I don't want my kids getting in trouble but I don't think they should be constantly in fear of either the mask is not on properly or if they're using a pool noodle to separate my kid from another kid.

And that was one of the decisions, my wife and I got together, like I don't think we can send them back to school like this. Like I know I couldn't -- I couldn't have survived in a school setting like that. I struggled, as much as most kids with some type of learning disability. I wasn't as smart as other kids.

To me school was a struggle, but at least I had the other

Several things that I witnessed that really alarmed me about my son were that as the year progressed, he exhibited signs of fear over what adults would say to him if he didn't have a mask on, even outside a school setting. It started exclusively in schools and it became something that started happening everywhere. So I would go to a restaurant with my kid and at the time he had to wear the mask to the table and then you could take your mask off, he was very reluctant to take his mask off if he was eating, even though he was allowed to take his mask off. He was fearful.

If I didn't give him a mask immediately when we would stand up, for instance if he went to the bathroom, he would grab his shirt and try to cover his face or take his hands and try to cover his face and look around fearfully.

My daughter told me an incident that happened at lunch, with the teacher's aide that was actually my son's -- in my son's class who -- my daughter would pull her mask down at lunch and put it under her nose and keep her head low in hopes of not being seen so she could take breaks. And there was a teacher's aide who would walk over to her and get down very low at the table and put her head down like this to check her face. She had to

get down and look in order to see what my daughter was She had her eyes on her and gave -- both my children described a fear of getting in trouble, especially my son, every day. And I would try to encourage him to give himself breaks and his response was I'll get in trouble. They'll make me go to the principal's office. And what's interesting was that it was hard to blame them because I'm a teacher and I was in that setting and I have the same feeling. I had a constant sense of looking over my shoulder for fear that I would do something that would get me in trouble. was constant and I still feel it today in school. It's not as bad as it was last year but I still have that feeling that I may do something that's going to get me in trouble. I may be standing too close to one of my students who need help.

Last year I wasn't even allowed to approach their desk, so they would ask me for help and I was supposed to be a certain distance from them but I can't help them with what they're working on if I can't see what they're working on, and I felt like I was going to get in trouble for something all of the time. So of course my young children were going to feel that way as well.

I also personally, because I was experiencing what they were experiencing simultaneously with them, it was

MR. PICCIRILLI: Just a summary. I don't think South Kingstown had a policy. I know Glocester had a policy. I wrote it. It was optional.

given him something. It should have been attached to the executive order, it wasn't. So that's all I'm asking.

MR. FIELD: Judge, we'll make the inquiry to the Governor's office. I just want to make clear, and first of all this is the first time we are hearing this, so we don't know what the Governor's Office has. Just because it's in the executive order doesn't mean there are documents in the Governor's Office possession to justify that sentence.

I'm fairly certain, even though I've never been involved in the process, that the Governor takes oral advice. He relies on oral commitment. So I don't know if that was done in this case or supported by documents that the Governor's Office has. We'll make the inquiry. I just want to make that clear right now.

THE COURT: So if you're asking only for what the Governor has, you may not get any. You recall Dr. McDonald describing a commission.

MR. PICCIRILLI: Whoever in state government. There must be someone in state government that has this information to compile this information.

THE COURT: What the Department of Education may have is different from the executive office.
